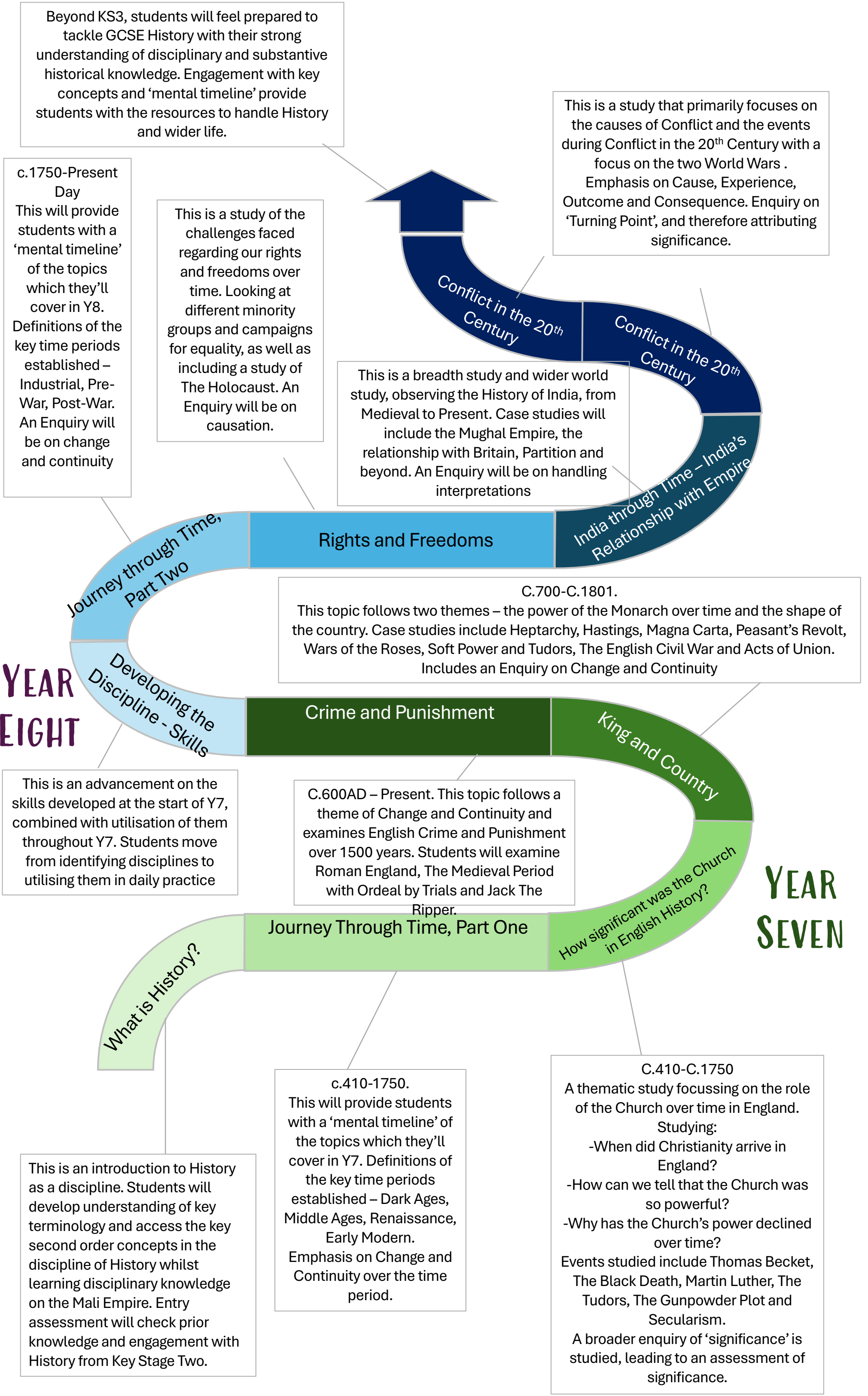
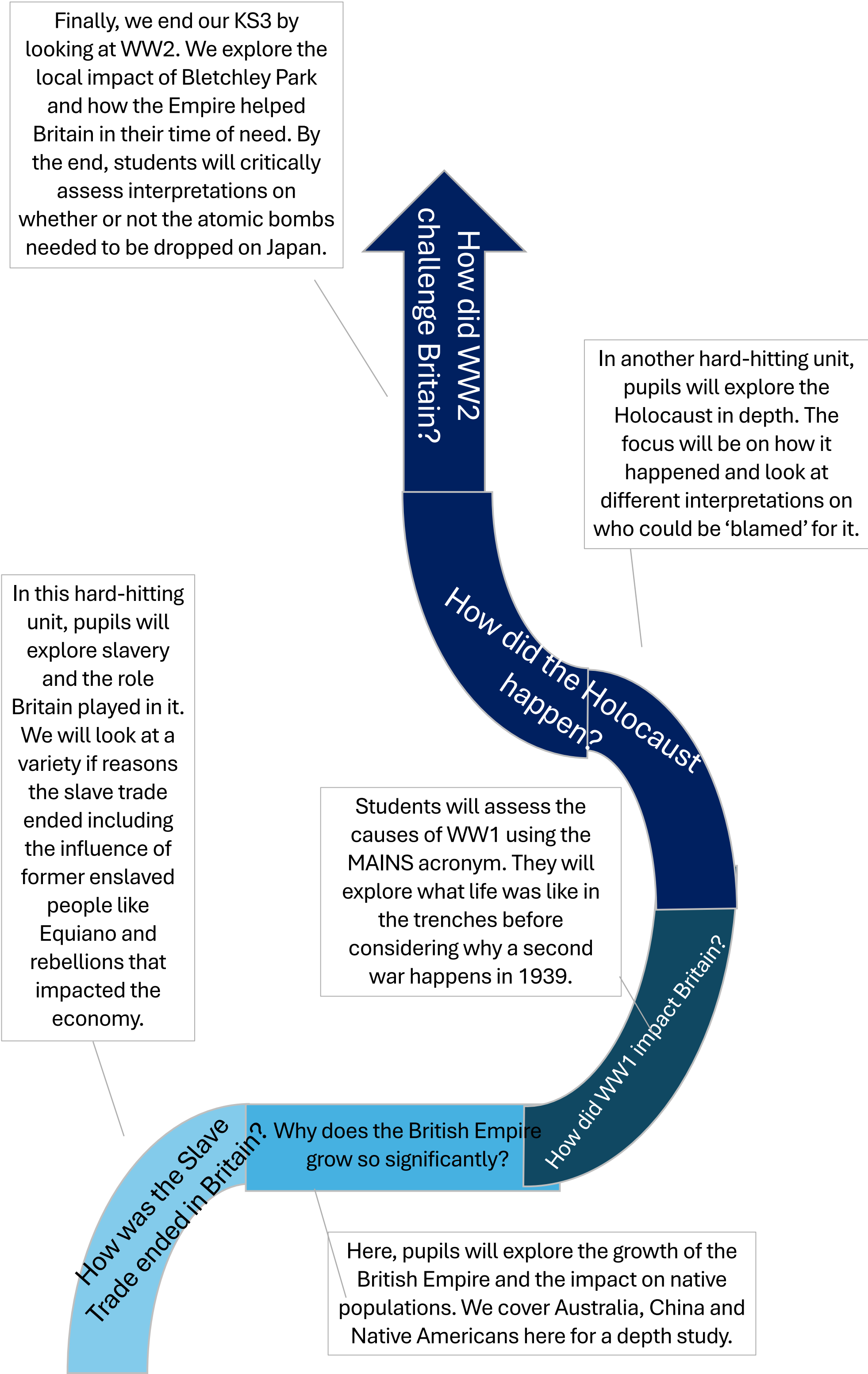

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YEAR EIGHT

How did the Industrial Revolution change Britain?

This unit begins by considering Britain had an advantage in industrialising. Mostly, we will focus on child workers and the end of youth labour.

This unit explores the religious impact of the Tudors, from the initial Reformation all the way through Mary I's Counter-Reformation and ending with Elizabeth I's Middle Way. As part of this, our students will also cover how portraits were used to demonstrate power.

How did English priorities change in the Stuart and Georgian Era?

Here we will look at the beginnings of a recognisable Britain. We will cover the start of the British Empire, the English Civil War and look at the American Revolution.

How much religious change was there in the Tudor Era?

Who had power in the Medieval Era?

This unit explores power over time in our country. We begin by seeing how the Church held power then move into how that power shifts with the Reformation in 1534 under Henry VIII. We will look at other examples of the monarchs retaining power. Finally, we will look at how the people gained power through events like the Peasants Revolt and the first Parliament.

How significant was conquest in the Medieval Era?

Here, we will look at the Battle of Hastings of 1066 and explore the consequences of the Norman Conquest. We will also explore how medical care worked in this era. Finally, we will compare life in the Medieval Era to the Mali Empire in Africa.

England Before 1066?

This is an introduction to History as a discipline. Students will look at how Britain changed from the Romans to King Alfred the Great. We will look at ancient monuments like White Horse Hill, what life was like for people living in this era and the Heptarchy: when England was divided into 7 kingdoms.
